Nature of support proposed 2016/17

A large proportion of the pupil premium money will be allocated to staffing costs. This will ensure that pupils retain a high level of staff:pupil ratio to enable the curriculum and delivery to be appropriate to the wide range of needs in the school.

Support and funding will also be allocated to those pupils eligible for PPG to access residential visits, extra-curricular activities, enrichment opportunities and specialised equipment and materials.

Below is a breakdown of some of the areas of support targeted for this year.

Proposed Outcomes for pupils eligible for the PPG spending 2016/17

Pupils have full access to the curriculum through increased staffing ensuring staff:pupil ratio is high, adapted materials or equipment, enrichment and additional opportunities. Pupil progress of those receiving PPG is in line with other pupils in the school.
