Outcome

Understand how to care for animals and wildlife in the garden.

There are many ways we can make a garden friendlier to the wildlife that visits it; including birds, butterflies, insects and hedgehogs. This challenge is about making something for an outside space to better accomodate wildlife in some way.

How to approach this challenge

Make a home for a hedgehog out of a cardboard box.

OR

Make a bird feeder out of a recycled plastic bottle.

 You will need: a cardboard box (Approximately 15cm square) a carrier bag or bin bag pair of scissors old newspaper or dry leaves or folifage 	1 Turn the cardboard box upside down and cut out a hole for the door	2 Find somewhere quiet and sheltered to place the house in your garden
3 Half-fill the inside with torn newspaper or dry leaves/foliage	4 Cover the roof of the house in the carrier bag to protect it from the rain	5 Place more foliage on top of the house to camouflage it

You will need: • a plastic bottle • a pair of scissors	1 Cut out a circular hole out of one side of the bottle halfway up	2 Pour the bird seed into the bottle filling it up to where the hole starts
 a pair of seissors some string or gardening wire bird seed 		
3 Find the middle of the string and wrap it twice around the top of the bottle	4 Tighten the cap over the string and make sure the ends are fairly even	5 Tie the bird feeder to a strong branch and leave for the birds to enjoy!
