The Samaritan covered the dying man in his cloak.



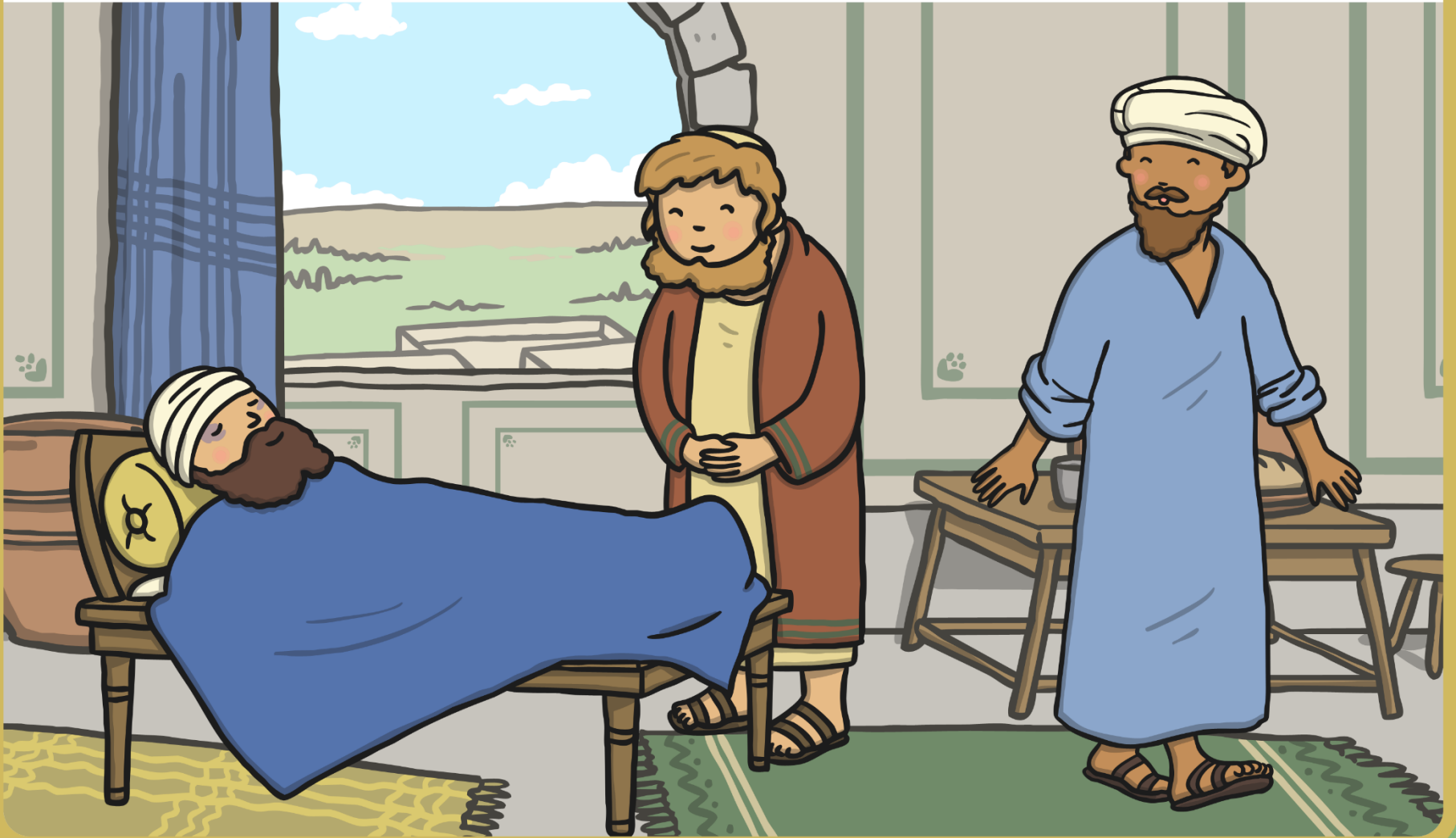
He put the man on his donkey and took him to a nearby inn.
