

Aston and Jimmy have been writing stories.



There have been a few birthdays too and Aston, Tyler, Max and Riley have all celebrated their birthdays in "lockdown" style...



Happy Belated Birthday to Connor and Tristan who have celebrated their birthdays during lockdown.





Who are the new TIS therapists?



David Marson (Occupational Therapist) and Katalin Halasz (Physiotherapist) have recently joined the TIS team and works in both St Anthony's and Fordwater schools.

David writes:

'It's great to be part of the new TIS team and we look forward to working with staff and parents/carers in developing the service over time. My background is as an Occupational Therapist both in adult neurological rehabilitation and in community children and families services in Surrey. My personal experience is as a father to a teenager with ASD which certainly impacts how I seek to work with parents and schools in supporting children. Particular interests include coaching models, routines based intervention and the use of technology to support children develop daily living skills.'

Katalin previously worked in special needs schools and has special interests in rebound therapy and hydrotherapy/ swimming. She writes: 'I am really looking forward to working with staff and students and being part of the team.'
