
When your child comes in to the Primary Department of St Anthony's School there might be lots of questions you will no doubt want answering.

Daily Routines

When pupils arrive they get off their transport and go into the playground (or hall/classbases if wet), where they are supervised by staff, until the bell goes.

08.30 - 08.55 Breakfast Club

08.55 - 12.00 Morning sessions (including a 15 minute break between 10.00 and 10.30)

12.00 - 12.45 Lunch

12.45 - 2.55 Afternoon sessions (including a break between 2.05 and 2.15)

Breakfast Club

Every morning from 8.30am until 8.55am in the hall we provide a light breakfast of cereal, toast and juice. Pupils can go on any days they wish and we ask for a voluntary donation towards the costs.

Snack Time

We provide a healthy snack at break time and request a small contribution towards the cost of this. Some children have a restricted diet and we ask you to send in packets of what your child prefers. We also have a tuck shop once a week and we suggest pupils bring in no more than £1. Please also note that we are a nut aware school and only provide snacks that do not contain nuts. Please do not send your child into school with fizzy drinks.

Lunch



Meals are cooked on the premises. Our kitchen staff provide a choice menu, which includes hot meals and a salad bar. See example hot meals menu on page 11.

All pupils in Reception, Year 1 & 2 are entitled to a free school meal. If you would like your

child to access this, please inform the school office. If you do not wish to access a free school meal and would prefer to provide your child with a packed lunch (this would not be provided by the school), again please inform the school office.

For those in Y3-Y6, meals cost £2.35 per day. Payment can be made on Parentmail.

Other Clubs

Several clubs are held during the lunch break and after school i.e. swimming, dance, these do change and details are sent home at the beginning of each half term. Some of these have a small charge. Mrs Strudwick manages the clubs.

Home/School Book

Each child in the Primary Department will have a home/school book. We believe that your child's needs are best met when teachers and parents/carers work together. Please use the book to note anything that would help us to know your child better e.g. interests, friends, pets, weekend activities, family events etc. Maybe you would like to ask us questions. As staff, we shall do the same regarding your child's school experiences. In this way the book will help form a record of your child's time in the Primary Department. Although we would like the books returned every day, please don't feel you (or we) have to write in them each time, use them only when you think it necessary. We look forward to hearing from you.

Transport

Where necessary, transport arrangements are made by Transport Section, at County Hall. You can contact them on 0330 222 4224. You are asked to make sure your child is at the correct place at the right time and the pupils are expected to behave sensibly and politely to each other, the drivers and escorts. If your child is absent or will not be going on the regular transport you are required to contact the driver or escort and let them know. Please also contact transport with any changes in medication/health so the plans are always up to date.



Homework

The Junior Department (Y3-Y6) supports the principles of homework. Homework activities are different according to the individual child's ability and are not necessarily set on a weekly basis and are not considered to be compulsory until Year 6. However, all children are expected to read regularly at home. We know that by working together and supporting each other we will be able to make homework a positive experience.

Pupil Behaviour

We strive to build positive relationships within an atmosphere of understanding and care. Our pupils are expected to follow the school rules and any negative behaviour is dealt with fairly and quickly.

On admission we ask that both pupils and parents/carers sign our code of conduct as recognition of the importance we place on joint responsibility for pupil behaviour with good manners, honesty and effort expected.

We know that it is only with your support that we can reach a solution to problems which may arise and we will contact you either by telephone, email or letter should such a situation occur.

Parents/carers are welcome in school and we hope you will contact us if there are any problems outside the school which we may be able to help with.

Notices

Letters and notices are sent home either in your child's bag or by Parentmail. Please ensure you check with your child whether any letters have been sent home.

Absence

You are legally required to inform the school of any absence or lateness on the actual day of absence. Please telephone the school office on 01243 785965 or emailing schooloffice@st-ants.org by 9.30am. If you know your child is going to be absent in advance, please notify us by letter. If we do not receive any reason for absence, we will contact you to discuss and follow up.

Holiday and Days Off in Term Time

Absence for annual holiday will not be granted unless there are exceptional circumstances. Holidays not authorised will be noted as unauthorised. Please note that absence for exceptional circumstances can only be authorised by the Headteacher using the appropriate Holiday Form (available from the office) in advance.

Parents/Carers Evenings

An informal parents/carers open evening especially for 'New Pupils' will be held early in the Autumn Term, you will receive a letter giving you details. Then a further parent/carer/teacher meetings for pupils will be held during the Summer Term.

During the school year, parents/carers will be invited to attend an Annual Review when we meet to discuss your child's needs. Parents/carers will receive a school report towards the end of the Summer Term. If you would like to discuss this or speak to a member of staff at any time, we will be happy to make an appointment with you. Just make a note in the Home/School book and we will arrange a day.

Jewellery

Whilst we do not allow an excessive amount of jewellery, we do allow each student to wear:

one small ring, one pair of ear studs

one chain (inside the clothing)

a watch

For P.E. swimming and practical subjects,

must be removed. Earrings may be covered with a plaster if necessary.

Make-Up

No make-up or nail varnish is allowed.

Personal Equipment

We discourage your child from bringing expensive personal equipment into school due to the danger of loss or breakage and cannot accept any responsibility for such items.

Charging Policy

The school operates a charging policy that covers activities which are <u>not</u> required as part of the National Curriculum – such as:

- Board and lodging on residential visits
- Activities which take place more that 50% out of school time.

Letters will go home about trips details any costs involved. We also keep a separate fund to support parents/carers who are in financial difficulty. Full details of the charging policy can be obtained from the school office.

Outdoor Education

A major part of our outdoor curriculum activity is called 'Woodland Wonders'. This takes place twice a year for half a term for Y3-Y6. Year 6 pupils also have the opportunity to take part in a residential camp. Further details are sent home in the Spring Term. Day trips are also organised to places such as Paultons Park and Fishers Farm. To enable all pupils to benefit from the experience, costs are kept to a minimum and we are able to offer financial support in certain cases. Pupils will experience outdoor learning in a fun, challenging yet engaged way.



Horse Riding



In Years 3-6 classes will have the opportunity to go horse riding with the RDA for a half-term. You will receive a letter and forms that need to be completed. The school will provide suitable riding uniform.

'We have had a great time at horse riding. For some of us it is the first time we have been on a horse'.

Fund Raising

We select certain charities to support throughout the year. One regular method of fund raising is the Non-Uniform Day which we hold on the last day of every half term. Pupils may wear their own clothes to school and bring in a voluntary donation.

Some of the charities that we have supported in recent years are: Children In Need, Sports Relief, McMillan Cancer, Genes for Jeans, Red Nose Day.

Emergency School Closure

A decision to close the school is not taken lightly and is usually made if there are health and safety issues. The safety of pupils and staff is the prime concern in any decision made. A decision will be made as early as possible, usually by 7am. If the school has to close, parents/carers will be informed in the following ways:

- Parentmail the system sends parents and carers texts and emails with emergency information and reminders about school events such as parents/carers evenings and sports day.
