








History




The course enables pupils to understand some of the key features of European History from the pioneering inventions of the Industrial Revolution to the turbulent inter-war period and the subsequent war with Germany (1919-1945). Learners will be encouraged to use historical sources to find out about different societies. The course will cover Transport in the Industrial Revolution, The Treaty of Versailles, Weimar Germany, The rise of Hitler and the Nazi Party and the impact of WWII on Britain. Our Prejudice and Discrimination against others topic covers the Holocaust and we study the life of Gandhi.

























Geography



<u>Population</u>: Pupils will consider how and why the population is changing in the United Kingdom by investigating details of birth, death rates and migration. To support this pupils will investigate how this change is affecting people in the UK by looking at the impact on employment and services and how people respond to these issues. The long term effects on the UK are analysed.


Tourism: The topic will enable pupils to identify key features of tourism by explaining the terms 'tourism' and tourist. They will investigate how tourism has changed since the 1960's and identify trends and patterns using data to discuss its impact. Responding to a Major Tectonic Event: Pupils will learn the different features that tectonic events create. They will identify the causes of events and identify areas of tectonic activity on earth. Pupils will consider the effect on humanity and the environment.
