




History




- Germany between 1919 and 1939 The turbulent inter-war period. The Treaty of Versailles, Weimar Germany and the rise of Hitler and the Nazi Party.
- Prejudice and Discrimination against People Our topic covers the Holocaust. Secondly we learn about Gandhi and his struggles to gain independence for India from British rule.
- Britain and WWII The impact of War on Britain.
- Historical Change Over Time- We learn about roads, railways and canals and the pioneering inventions of the Industrial Revolution. The Police Force and the case of Jack the Ripper.

























Geography



<u>Population</u>: Pupils will consider how and why the population is changing in the United Kingdom by investigating details of birth, death rates and migration. To support this pupils will investigate how this change is affecting people in the UK by looking at the impact on employment and services and how people respond to these issues. The long term effects on the UK are analysed.


Tourism: The topic will enable pupils to identify key features of tourism by explaining the terms 'tourism' and tourist. They will investigate how tourism has changed since the 1960's and identify trends and patterns using data to discuss its impact. Responding to a Major Tectonic Event: Pupils will learn the different features that tectonic events create. They will identify the causes of events and identify areas of tectonic activity on earth. Pupils will consider the effect on humanity and the environment.
