We have been reading:

Rumble in the jungle and One Day on our Blue Planet in the Rainforest

We celebrated World Book Day with dressing up, our favourite stories and had a visit from Year 11





We have been very creative this term playing different instruments, drawing animals on the computer and going to an art event at Pallant House Gallery







The class have been learning about colour and print. We have mixed colours together and used them in lots of different ways, including spraying and splatting with sponges!

Sycamore celebrated World Book Day. The children looked so colourful, we made capes and masks and read so many books! Some children came to read to us, look how hard we are listening.



Reggie and Jayden made brilliant 'Supertato' models. They planned it first and then found all the things they needed.



We have been learning about the Lunar New Year and how it is celebrated around the world.

We tried using chopsticks and made a dragon mask because it is the 'Year of the Dragon'. We had a procession and made some loud music too!





Sycamore have been learning about what plants need to thrive. We have planted some seeds and are growing bean seeds in plastic 'greenhouses' to see the roots and the shoots burst into life.



We have been learning how to measure objects using nonstandard and standard measures.

Our topic this term has been rainforests. We have been learning about the Amazon rainforest and the different layers. We have also been learning about the different animals that live in their habitats in the different layers of the rainforest. We have also been reading and writing diary entries based upon our class narrative and currently creating fact files. In numeracy we have been learning 3 and 6 times tables, fractions and time.



This term Rowan Class have been learning how to play the ukuleles in music, they have been learning how play the different beats in time with different music. They have also created their own class song using the different animals that live in the rainforest. Rowan Class have been going to forest school and they are enjoying playing different games, starting fires and cooking foods around the fire.













Rowan Class are learning about an artist called Henri Rousseau, who has created artwork of the rainforest. They have all created their own rainforest shoeboxes using a range of materials. Rowan Class are currently planning and creating their own rainforest collages.

We have had a busy Spring term in Yew class! Our learning has been through our Amazon Rainforest topic where we have explored the layers of the rainforest and the animals within them.

We enjoyed taking part in the Children's Concert at Chichester Festival Theatre in January and going to Forest school in the first half of the Spring term.

Year 7 are looking at the Spring term topic Aboriginal

With this topic they explore how Aboriginals' art is used to tell their stories and have looked at the work of Betty Mbitjana, her paintings are based on footprints in the sand, that were created during ceremonial dancing. The children have created their own inspired piece of work using oil pastels.





Year 8 are looking at the Spring term topic British Crafts

One of the artists they are exploring is LS Lowry, an artist who originates from Manchester. They have developed a different way to interpret his work, he uses stick figures in his paintings and the children have been making their own 3D Lowry figures using tin foil, masking tape and paint.

ENGLISH

Year 7

We have been looking at the text The Iron Man by Ted Hughes. The pupils have completed storyboards and discussed the characters and plot of the story. They have a weekly Makaton session and they have all been contributing very well. They particularly enjoyed the pancake day lesson, signing the different toppings on their pancakes.

Year 8

We have been looking at non-fiction texts and report writing based around the theme of British Wildlife. Pupils have looked at British mammals and reptiles as well as local insects. They have chosen the animals they want to investigate further and write their reports on. We had a visit from Brent Lodge Wildlife Centre earlier in the term. The pupils enjoyed listening to Alex and learning about the calls of different owls.





ENGLISH

Year 9

We have been learning about The Tempest by William Shakespeare in English. The pupils have completed comprehension questions on the text. They have discussed plot, character and the setting of the story. We have looked at a mixture of the original text and simplified text and they have done very well with the sections in original text. For fun they created their own versions of Ariel's scary mask.



Year 10

We have been learning about Running Wild by Michael Morpurgo in English. The pupils have completed comprehension questions on the text and discussed character and plot in the text. They have completed storyboards to consolidate their understanding of the chapters. They also complete a comprehension task



each week based on the First News





Year 11

The pupils have been working hard to complete their coursework. They researched Australia and the UK in order to reply to the fictional pen pal letter they received and to include accurate information about their own areas and interests in their autobiographical reply. They have also completed their reading papers this term.

HISTORY

The Year 7s are learning about the Norman Period in History 1066-1154. They have learnt about the Battle of Hastings. Pupils have enjoyed the role play which supports learning of this period, they re-enacted the Battle of Hastings, tried on chain mail and used measuring clicker wheels to work out how far through school the 70 metre Bayeux tapestry would have reached from various points.



HISTORY

<u>Year 8</u>

The Year 8s are studying the Native Americans and the tribes of the First Nation people. Pupils are learning how tribes adapted to their environments and are focusing on the Sioux Tribe and their relationship with the buffalo. 8K had a go at using a bow and arrow as they were training to be Native American warriors. They were very skilful.



<u>Year 10</u>

Year 10 have been working hard on their Humanities Entry Pathways coursework. They have learned about the interwar period and the problems Germany faced with the Weimar Republic and the rise of the Nazi party.



<u>Year 11</u>

The Year 11s have successfully completed their History coursework for the WJEC Humanities Entry Pathway qualification. Well done to all of our Year 11s for working so hard over the last 2 years. We are currently preparing to visit Ypres in Belgium for a 2 day tour of the Battlefields.



MATHS

<u>KS3 Maths</u>

One of our topics this half term has been 'Money'. The pupils have been practsing making different amounts. Year 7 made some foil boats and counted how much money their boats were able to hold before they sank to the bottom of the tank! They did some brilliant counting in twos.



Year 9 have been applying their Money skills to some real life situations and have used the 'Yo Sushi' menus to create their ideal dinner and work out how much it would cost, using the coloured bowl key. They enjoyed being able to see how this skill would help them when they are older!

SCIENCE

Year 7 are presently learning about Electrical Circuits. They are learning this concept through observing flow of charges in insulators, making simple working electrical circuits, and using simulations (https://phet.colorado.edu/en/simulations/circuit-construction-kit-dc)



Year 8 pupils are learning about measuring Temperature and its applications. The below pictures show experiments to find out what is Melting Point.



In addition, Year 8 had the opportunity of having a trip to Winchester Science Museum to explore the applications of Forces in the real world



SCIENCE

Year 10 pupils started their Entry Pathways Qualifications in Science by building on Prior Knowledge acquired in Year 7 involving "Working with Electrical Circuits". The pupils explored this Unit in greater depth. The Unit is a 3 Credits Unit where pupils measure the current flowing in their circuits, investigate the effect of Voltage input on Current in a simple working circuit and its application and explore other sources of energy.



FOOD TECH

Thank you for your continued support this term and for all of the donations towards ingredients, it is very much appreciated. This term pupils across the year groups have continued to be busy with their cookery skills and have prepared a variety of different dishes from around the world.

Year 11s have concentrated on main meals as their focus in preparation for their BTec qualification and worked hard to create very tasty meals.

Year 10 have been busy planning and running a St Ant's healthy snack shop, where they made all of the snacks to sell. It was very successful raising £96 to go back into the department. It was enjoyed by pupils and staff!

Our year 9 pupils enjoyed learning about China and India and have cooked tasty Bombay potatoes and created Chinese table decorations. They have also been to Pizza Express to see how they make their pizzas, have go at making their own and experiencing behind the scenes in a high street restaurant. Year 8 have investigated dairy foods and enjoyed making strawberry milkshakes, fruit smoothies and pancakes which proved very popular.

The healthiest cooking award again goes to year 7 with their baking vegetables topic. They enjoyed making some very tasty butternut muffins, carrot twists and vegetable pasties. They were very proud of the result.















SUPPORT CENTRE

In the Support Centre we have been learning about the World of Work, exploring some of the jobs that we are interested in both within school and in the community. This week we had a visit from Robyn, a Veterinary Nurse, who came to tell us all about her job looking after poorly animals. Pupils really enjoyed dressing up and practicing bandaging skills, as well as inserting and

scanning for microchips. They also had great fun looking at x-rays, to see which weird and wonderful items some dogs had swallowed, including a spoon, a toy car and even a rubber duck!

Volunteering





Students form Years 10 and 11 have been working hard at Crimsham Farm this term to complete their 'Volunteering' section of their award. Jobs have included, mucking out animal enclosures, grooming the goats, collecting eggs and building pens.

LAND BASED STUDIES





The Year 10s this term have been learning about pests and diseases and how to control them. They have also been learning how to use secateurs and taking hard wood cuttings as well as learning techniques for plant care including thinning out, watering and using a propagator. They will soon begin growing plants and planting out their broad beans, onions, potatoes and other vegetables.

The Year 11s have been finishing their unit on Myself in the Community by visiting different places around Chichester. They have visited the Library, Cathedral, Noveum museum, Goodwood race course and airport, Chichester Theatre, Hospital, Priory Park, Ten Pin Bowling, Greggs, Railway and Bus Station and the Police Station.







Year 11 YAS

This half term Year 11 were visited by PC Brand who spoke to the class about rights and responsibilities and how to be a good citizen. They had a lot of interesting questions for him and they found out about what it is like to be a police officer.

As part of their Personal Care module, Year 11 have been visiting Chichester town regularly. They have seen how different places such as opticians and clothes shops are able to help them to look after and care for themselves. In Sports Direct, the pupils had fun putting together different outfits.

FRENCH

This term Year 9A have done extremely well in French. We have been building up our conversation to invite someone to join us for a social event.

Pupils have been practising using phones to ask someone if they would like to go on an outing.







In January all year groups focused on relationships. We explored what makes a healthy relationship, and what makes a relationship unhealthy. We covered friendships and other relationships too. We have continued to talk about different relationships we have both in and outside school, and the things we can do to help ensure our relationships are healthy ones.



We are now focusing on Mental Health and Wellbeing.

We are learning about all the ways that help towards keeping our body and mind healthy. We have learnt about why we need a balanced diet and how different food groups help with different things i.e. fighting off bugs, repair our skin, strong bones. We also explored what influences our food and drink choices. We have also learnt about teeth hygiene, personal hygiene, the importance of quality sleep, medicines and for older pupils smoking, vaping, alcohol, legal and illegal drugs.







Year 11 have been extremely busy.

Year 11 have taken part in Travel Training on a train where we travelled to Littlehampton.

Many Year 11s have attended 'Your Future 24' careers and transition event in Horsham where they met with a range of employers and organisations who can help them in adulthood.

SPORTS

<u>PE</u>

Our Year 11 PE ASDAN students have been out in the community this term looking at different sports facilities they may wish to access in the future. This included a trip to Westgate Leisure Centre where they had the opportunity to spend time in the new fitness room trying out the various equipment. This was then followed with a visit to Chichester College where our students were able to look at the different spaces, including the climbing wall and multiuse pitches.



The Year 10 students have been working on their leadership skills. They have learnt what skills are needed for effective leadership. Within small groups they have planned, practiced and delivered a variety of sporting games and activities to the Year 5 and Year 6 pupils.

10H Tutor Time - Talking Tuesdays

As well as time for additional support, our afternoon tutor sessions give us time to work as a group on different key skills.

Talking Tuesdays not only provide us with time to work on Makaton and signing skills but also provides an opportunity to work on developing social and emotional communication skills. This term we have been focusing on "All about Me" which helps to build pupils' self awareness. Topics covered include qualities and strengths, feelings, and how to be a good friend. Together we explored strategies that support pupils when they are feeling down or low and help them develop their resilience skills which will help them in the future.

In Maths we looked at capacity and measurement. We also used scales to estimate and find heavy, light and balanced.



In Science we have been looking at food groups. We have explored different food groups and been exposed to different tastes and textures.



In English we have been listening to and joining in with Bee & Me narrative. We made our own musical instruments and joined in with the story.

WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book day is a highlight of the school year. We celebrated together on 7th March with a variety of activities. Pupils and staff dressed up as a character from a book for the occasion. There were many themes for costumes, with classics such as Goldilocks and the three bears and Peter Pan, as well as modern classics like the Gruffalo and Supertato. Stories by Roald Dahl were also very popular choices. Mrs Correia arranged for older pupils to read to the younger ones in their classrooms, which was very much enjoyed. Our book swap table was very popular. Thanks to your generous donations, most of the pupils in school were able to leave with a donated book on the day. Book tokens from the World Book day were also given out to all pupils, don't forget to exchange your token for a book and keep reading all year round!











LIBRARY

On 26th February our local Lions Club came into school to present us with a set of books for the library. The Lions are a group of people who volunteer their time to support health and wellbeing in their local communities. They have a project to inspire children to tackle the issues of plastic pollution, climate change and habitat loss through an inspiring set of books - Wild Tribe Heroes.

The Wild Tribe Heroes, are set of colourful picturebooks which show how humans beings are making a positive impact helping wildlife in different parts of the world.

These beautiful books will be added to our Library as a class resource learning pack within our Environment Library resources.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

We are happy to show the finished art work that the Art club have made for weeks 1 and 2.

The turtles were made using paper plates and an assortment of different coloured tissue paper cut into squares, the children stuck the tissue paper onto the plate, then they drew legs, a head and tail onto green paper, cut them out and glued them onto complete the finished turtle.

The chickens were made by scrunching up yellow tissue paper into small pieces and putting it inside a plastic bottle, they then drew wings, feet and a beak onto orange and yellow paper, cut the shapes out and I attached them by asking where they wanted them placed using a glue gun, we finished them by adding some googley eyes.

These activities are easy and the children enjoyed making them, they get to take home anything that they make whilst in Art club.
