Little Group is all about offering the children an irresistible invitation to learn. All the adults and children in the room share the experience. It's messy, it's fun, and we all laugh and learn so much!



We have had fun finding out about our bodies and our senses and have been reading Funnybones and Dogger.














Rowan Class



SCIENCE







Year 10 pupils started the Autumn term with an introduction to their qualifications.







































HISTORY


The Judors

Year 8 have been learning about The Tudors. To consolidate their learning in the classroom, Year 8 visited The Mary Rose Museum and had a superb day out. Pupils explored all decks of the museum and took part in a workshop where they learned about what life was like aboard the Mary Rose and the jobs the crew undertook. They enjoyed handling artefacts and hearing individual crew stories. The highlight of the day was the new immersive *Dive the Mary Rose 4D* Experience. We look forward to going again.











Year 10 The Humanities Entry Pathways group have been learning about Germany between the Wars 1919-1939. They have learned about the signing of the Treaty of Versailles and the impact this was to have on the failure to keep peace in Europe after WWI. Here pupils are using role play to understand what happened during this period in History.

In History Year 7 pupils have been studying the Romans during the Autumn term. They have taken part in various role play activities including a Roman Boot Camp and Rena acting the story of Boudicca Queen of the Iceni.





In History Year 9 pupils have been studying the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade and the British Empire. They learned about the Trade Triangle, how slaves were captured and the conditions that Slaves endured once transported to America.





HISTORY

The Year 7s have started the year well in History and are keen historians. They have been learning history skills which include understanding timelines and what is historical evidence. This term pupils have visited Fishbourne Roman Palace. Pupils enjoyed exploring the site and seeing the fine mosaics, artefacts and the Palace gardens.







FOOD TECH

What a busy term this has been! We cannot believe that we are now in December and Christmas is just around the corner. We know how much our pupils enjoy their Food Technology lessons and are always very proud of what they have made.

Where our food comes from and food in season has been our focus this term. This enables our pupils to think about the impact of where our food travels from and what its source is.

Years 7 & 8 have been making dishes using fruit and vegetables in season and learning about why it is healthier to eat food that is sourced locally. Year 7s developed their preparation skills by working with different fruits and year 8 have been investigating how flour is made and where it comes from. They have enjoyed making a variety of breads and have designed and made their own flavour and style of bread.







Year 9 started their 'food around the world' topic by making British dishes; some very tasty trifles were created. They have also created other British classics such as a cooked breakfast using alternative healthier cooking methods rather than frying and sausages and mash. They are currently investigating Italian foods and recently designed and made their own pizzas.







FOOD TECH

Year 10 have begun their BTEC and ASDAN qualifications and have been very busy preparing and making healthy breakfasts and lunches. At the beginning of the term we focused on different ways to prepare eggs for breakfast. The pupils learnt about consumer awareness through talking about how the eggs we buy in the supermarkets are produced. The pupils thought about the different conditions the hens live in. From our discussions, the pupils felt that free range hen's had a better quality of life and therefore it would be better to buy free range eggs from the supermarkets if they could afford to.







Lastly, Year 11 have been very busy sourcing, preparing and cooking starters, using seasonal fruit to make deserts and main meals in preparation for their final assessment pieces for their BTEC qualification in home cooking in the Spring Term. They have all been working really hard, producing excellent dishes and considering how their dishes are presented. They really enjoyed making their own custard with baked apples and using the food colouring to experiment.









GEOGRAPHY

Year 7 - United Kingdom have been working very hard in their first term here at St Anthony's. They have been learning about the UK. We explored 'where we are in the world'. This included work on locating St Anthony's school, Chichester and understanding whey it os a city and looking with the help of Google Earth where we are in the UK.







<u>Year 8 - Peru</u> We enjoyed a trip to Cineworld Chichester to watch 'Paddington in Peru' as part of our current Geography topic.
Students loved following the adventures of Paddington down the Amazon river and through the rainforest eventually finding Aunt Lucy and the riches of El Dorado!

Students have been learning about 'plate tectonics' and how this can lead to volcanoes. They were very excited to carryout a mini volcanic eruption experiment.

Overall we came 3rd in the Boccia event for the West Sussex West area. This is a massive achievement for the children that took part, and we are all very proud of all of the students who took part in both the Boccia and Kurling events.


